- New- "Referral Plan Form"- To be on tables each week- (Member refers, Membership Committee closes - referrer becomes the sponsor);

### Board of Directors Meeting

October 2, 2007. Mr. Hietbrink called the meeting to order at 8:02 a.m.

Mr. Hietbrink reviewed the Club Goals for the new year including signing up 30 new members with a net gain of at least 5 members, retention of members and gaining Distinguished Club Status. These goals tie in well with the Division and District goals.

Mr. Wright, seconded by Mr. Zugel, moved the Club purchase Officers and Directors Liability Insurance as recommended by the International. The annual cost will be \$500, which is not in the current budget. The motion passed by voice vote.

Mr. Hietbrink thanked Mr. Liptrot, Zugel, and Krogh for their good work in the membership renewal campaign, with checks received tying in with renewing members.

Mr. Rood, Membership Chair, outlined a number of new initiatives for recruitment, but the bottom line is that the Board and the members must exert themselves to insure that new members are secured.

Mr. Wright said the Kiwanis Sponsors Campaign with 40 solicitors working, is up and running, and he hopes that members will provide other prospects to be contacted. Let campaign Chair Emerson Ham know if you have good prospects.

Gene McDonald reported that 24 restaurants have agreed to provide Chili, and we need a good turnout of attendees, to let the providers get good publicity for their efforts.

## Some Relief in Sight for Dial-Up Kiwaniogram Readers

A number of Kiwaniogram readers do not have high speed internet service. For them, having a document as large as the Kiwaniogram hit their e-mail inbox can be a maddening experience. However, help is available. It is a two step process.

The first step starts with letting me know that you do not have high speed internet. I will then take your e-mail address off the regular Kiwaniogram distribution list, and move it onto a list for dial-up readers. What taking your name off the

waniogram without the horrible download wait. Or you will be able to print a copy from the web site, but at a time when doing so suits *your* convenience.
