"AN EDUCATIONAL CHALLENGE":

In keeping with the goals of Kiwanis International to improve the lot of all children, our *Early Childhood Education Committee* has been searching for ways to improve the outcomes of public education in Savannah. Our efforts to encourage parents to read to their children, through the <u>Reach Out And Read</u> program, which we support in the Chatham County Health Department outpatient clinics, should be multiplied.

It is hard not to be excited about another program here in Savannah working to encourage parents to take a more active part in the education of their own children: Garrison Elementary School. Inner-city children from 18 months up through the 4 year old in Pre-K are in a special child care program of enrichment, learning to make eye-contact with the teacher and to speak in complete sentences. Parental participation to the tune of 20 hours per week, is the requirement for the child's enrollment. Parents attend classes about children's development and learn how in a disciplined, yet nurturing way, to help their children with reading and with discovering the world around them. The improvements in the grades of the first and second graders who had gone through this elaborate child care, when tested with the <u>No Child Left Behind</u> program, were such that the School was given a ranking of #21 (out of 4,000 elementary schools in Georgia) by the State's Director of Education.

Knowing what can be done in one of Savannah's 30 elementary schools, makes one wonder why the same program cannot be duplicated as entrance requirements for all of our schools. We still need tutoring and mentoring for those who have slipped into kindergarten with out the proper prerequisites, but as a society we are only now realizing that today's families have been "slipping up" on the education of their children from birth up to Kindergarten. Parents count, but they need our help.

Our representatives on the Board of Education and our local and State legislators need to know our feelings. Though many of us are senior citizens, this is <u>our</u> problem, because the costs of doing nothing about "front-loading" expenses will cost us 7 to 10 more down the road. Tom Clark
