The 2006-07 Fund Raising Team has met and set the programs/events dates and fund raising levels for the upcoming year and the challenge is clearly before us. We are planning to raise \$88,000 next year and remembering our financial BAM Goal for the 2005-2008 program years, we need to average more than \$83,000 per year to meet our \$1 million goal by our 20th Anniversary. Our first Program for next year, the Trifecta Sponsor Program, carries our largest fund raising expectation (\$35,000) and is due to start in August. So, we're about to get underway and Bill Wright and Emerson Ham will need everyone's support to achieve the desired goal.

Also at this month's Board meeting, we'll make the important decisions regarding which Charities we'll support and to what level as we develop the plan to expend the dollars we raised this past year. At the same time these decisions are made, we will be asking last year's Trifecta Sponsors to attend an upcoming breakfast meeting during August and September to witness the parsing out of the checks to these deserving Organizations. Hopefully this will help them see how their contributions are being used and how thankful the receiving groups are so they will be inclined to contribute again next year.

And finally, growing our Club is a top priority and Pete Liptrot and our Membership Committee have developed a plan that will enhance our recruitment efforts. Basically, they're asking members to name someone they feel would make a good Kiwanian who then will be asked to attend a cocktail party to see and hear what Kiwanis is all about. Our first phase of the plan asks the Board members for the name of a prospect. We'll closely monitor the effectiveness of the program and provide feedback on the results as we move forward with this idea.

Despite the onset of summer when so many of our members are gone to their northern abodes, there's still a lot going on. It's just a reminder that there's really no time when we're not thinking about the kids!!!

The Dollars For Doer's program provides an opportunity for club members to request a contribution (maximum \$300) for a Humanitarian organization in which the member is involved, ie. Board member, officer, volunteer, etc. This is a great way for members to help organizations that are not existing funded charities of the Club.

Contributions by the Club have averaged \$5,000 over the last nine years; and for the first eight months of this fiscal year the Club has approved ten requests in the total amount of \$3,000.

Joyce Glenn- request for Christmas presents for children in Casa (Court Appointed Special Advocate). \$300.

Erv Hietbrink- request for necessary office equipment at the Mediation Center. Several club members serve as trained mediators at the Center. \$300.

Bill Wright- request for funds to assist the two full time chaplains at Good News Jail & Prison Ministry. Bill is Chairman of The President's Council- Chatham County.\$300.

Tom Rood- request for funds for the annual kid's fishing derby sponsored by the Coastal Conservation Association-Skidaway Island Chapter. Tom is fishing program director. \$300.

Dave Fox- request for funds to support programs for inner city "at risk" boys which are conducted by Young Men Of Honor. \$300.

Membership Committee


We welcome two new members this month, Ron Webber sponsored by Tom Rood and John Bradley sponsored by Frank McCarthy.
