### **Breaking Breakfast Meeting News!**

We are pleased to announce a change in the breakfast offerings at our weekly meetings. Several approaches have been tried over the past couple of years, all of which have been less than satisfactory. Trish Shanahan, Joyce Glenn and Ben Gustafson have been meeting with the Plantation staff for the past several months to negotiate a breakfast menu and pricing plan that meets both Kiwanis and Plantation Club needs. The new menu (see box this page) is somewhat flexible in the ability to modify offerings in response to member wishes and allows for a different menu in succeeding weeks.

We must guarantee the Plantation Club a minimum equivalent of \$310/week (equivalent to 20 full breakfasts at \$13.00 each, plus 20 coffee-only sales at \$2.50 each). This guaranteed food and beverage minimum serves to cover the cost of the use of the ballroom. If we do not have \$310 in breakfast orders, we must make up the difference from our club's administrative resources.

We have been assured by the Plantation managers and Chef Sam that the new breakfast buffet—which will begin on December 22—is going to be high quality, nicely presented and delicious.

We will also be offering an incentive to purchase the full breakfast. Those who buy breakfast and participate in our 50/50 drawing will be given an extra matching number of 50/50 tickets. (For example, if you buy 3 tickets for \$2, you will receive 6 if you have also bought the full breakfast that day.) We are requesting that each of you try the new breakfast offering and let us know how you like it.

For planning purposes, Plantation Club requires that we provide a headcount in advance of the number of people who will buy breakfast. To reserve your breakfast:

- Sign up with Chris Butler at the check-in table
- Send an email to info@kiwanisofskidaway by noon Tuesday Reservations for coffee-only service are not required.

We are developing an RSVP system to accept and compile breakfast reservations on our website. The system will allow you to make reservations for one or more meetings for yourself and your guests. We are evaluating WordPress plugins for this, and the new RSVP system should be available by mid-January. Stay tuned for news!

# **Kiwanis Announces New Foundation Name:** Kiwanis Children's Fund

This is an exciting time for the Kiwanis International Foundation. Very soon, we will begin the rebranding of our foundation as 👃 the Kiwanis Children's Fund, which has been approved by the Kiwanis International Foundation Board of Trustees. We believe the Kiwanis Children's Fund is poised for greatness. That change will take place very soon, and we are excited to share with you some of the details behind what we know will be a fruitful, strategic move for all of Kiwanis. This decision was made after an extensive study and careful consideration.

- Third-party consultants evaluated our foundation's brand and recognized an opportunity to increase positive awareness and participation by connecting the name of our foundation to the Kiwanis motto: serving the children of the world.
- A global survey in seven languages overwhelmingly supported Kiwanis members' interest in a name change that ties our foundation to our mission.
- The name change is a logical extension of Kiwanis International's brand solidification.

The benefits of the rebranding efforts will be far-reaching. With enhanced understanding of our foundation's purpose and a stronger intellectual and emotional connection to the Kiwanis motto, members will be more predisposed to make donations to the Kiwanis Children's Fund. We believe this will lead to greater participation among clubs and individuals, increased availability of funds and, most importantly, more services provided to kids. The logistics of the change are well under way.

- The Kiwanis International Foundation will be "doing business as" the Kiwanis Children's Fund; so there are no legal changes required.
- Kiwanis International and Kiwanis Children's Fund staff members are updating materials in phases in order to implement the change as quickly and efficiently as possible, with minimal financial impact.
- The logo for the Kiwanis Children's Fund will stay aligned with the current Kiwanis International branding strategy. A sample of the logo is included at the bottom of this message.
- Kiwanis International will craft special versions of the name "Kiwanis Children's Fund" to reflect nuances in various languages and cultures. For example, through our survey, we learned that "fund" is an unfavorable term in South America; so the Kiwanis Children's Fund will be referred to in Spanish as the Kiwanis Children's Foundation.
- The Kiwanis Children's Fund will continue implementing best practices for fundraising and distribution of funds to support Kiwanis clubs, districts and district foundations as they serve the children of the world.

We hope you share the same sense of excitement and optimism as we begin this important step into the future of the Kiwanis Children's Fund.
