President's Greeting



Fellow Kiwanians,

As I mentioned in the last Kiwanigram, I am going to spend the next few months focusing my message on some of the important behind-the-scenes efforts that ensure our club continues to build on our incredible legacy—leadership growth, the fundraising process, and the steps we take to fund our agencies.

Our fundraising process is what helps many of our low-budget agencies remain in business in our community helping at-risk kids. As a club, we contribute thousands of volunteer hours annually but are still unable to impact every aspect of what it takes to ensure the success of these charitable organizations. We realized that these agencies that are on the front line helping the at-risk children of Greater Savannah every day needed more help; and we accepted the reponsibility to contribute more. That "more" is the money that we raise to help replace tables and chairs needed for children to study on, fill refridgerators with food that can be sent home, fund scholarships to summer camp, fix vans to transport kids to afterschool activities, fund training seminars to teach young parents how to properly teach their children the basics, buy trophies and fund events for Special

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Olympics, buy beds and stock shelves in emergency shelters, help families offset the living expenses while caring for their children who are undergoing cancer treatments...and these are only a few of the ways that we help through our fundraisers.

Our members are the brain trust behind our approach; there is no fool-proof fundraising handbook that Kiwanis sends out each year. We take a risk everytime we step up to the plate with one of our headlining events, whether it is chili, pancakes, music, or flag sales. Kiwanis of Skidaway is very different than many other service organizations, in that we only charge \$125 per year as a membership fee vs. others that charge hundreds and include their fundraising money in the membership fee. But, with that low membership fee, we accept the responsiblity to raise money through selling tickets to the Chili Cook Off, Pancake Breakfast, and CONCERT ON THE GREEN; generating interest in our newest program, Show Our Colors; and soliciting business partners for our Corporate Sponsor Program.

The risk we take is that no one buys any tickets to our events, no flags are flown, no businesses see value in what we do. If we fail in our fundraising efforts, our club won't go bankrupt and our personal lives won't change too much. But if we fail in our fundraising efforts, we will fail to live up to the promise we made to ourselves to help those children who need us, and now we are talking about the lives of children changing.

So what can you do to ensure we won't fail the kids? Get involved with the Fundraising Process:

- **1. Sell tickets** to our events: They are great productions and are well worth the ticket price.
- **2. Volunteer** to help the day of the event, so you can get comfortable with the event process.
- **3. Volunteer** to be a Sub-Committee Chairperson.
- **4. Volunteer** to be a Co-Chairperson of an event.

That is it, plain and simple. When asked to help, say yes. And, each year put your name in the hat to move up and take on greater responsibility. We have great leadership and membership that will do what it takes to be successful. Ask yourself if you have given all you can to serve. Dollars for Doers Program

Purpose and Recipient Eligibility

The Dollars for Doers program is designed to provide an opportunity for any Kiwanis Club of Skidaway member to request a contribution for a worthy recipient of their choice. The member must be involved with the organization for which the request is intended. A worthy recipient in this instance must be recognized as a tax-exempt, non-profit organization. The organization must be humanitarian in nature and preferably have an emphasis on children; however, all humanitarian organizations will be considered.

Procedures for Requesting Funding

- Funding requests must be made on Kiwanis Club of Skidaway's request form, available on our Club's website and from the Dollars for Doers chairman.
- The request must include an explanation of the member's involvement, i.e. Board member, officer, volunteer, etc., as well as provide the number of Kiwanis members involved and the average number of hours spent each month on volunteer activities, plus provide the name and purpose of the organization and how the contribution will be used.
- Requests to existing funded charities are not eligible for funding.

- Only one contribution to any one organization during the Kiwanis year (October 1–September 30 of each year) may be requested.
- Individual members may receive a maximum of two approved funding requests in any Kiwanis year.
- Each request is limited to a maximum of \$300.
- Kiwanis members must submit the request to the Dollars for Doers chairperson for procedural review/approval and forwarding to the Secretary for scheduling Board review and approval. The member requesting the contribution may be asked to attend the Board meeting at which the request is considered to answer any questions Board members may have.
- Checks for approved requests will be available to the member for forwarding to the recipient after approval by the Board.

Dollars for Doers Awards

Since Dollars for Doers was established in 1996, over \$56,000 has been awarded for distribution. On average, \$3,000 is awarded each year. Thus far in our 2012/13 Kiwanis year, three requests aggregating \$900 have been awarded.


