# ELIMINATE maternal/neonatal tetanus

### **Project Update**

Project Eliminate is a major undertaking by Kiwanis International in conjunction with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to eliminate maternal and neo-natal tetanus (MNT) worldwide.

This disease currently ravages children and mothers in 32 countries central Africa and Asia, down from 40 countries when Project Eliminate began in 2010. The elimination tool is a series of three (3) vaccinations for women of childbearing age. Without this

simple preventative measure, up to 60,000 children a year die of this disease, one every 9 minutes.

Kiwanis International is undertaking a five-year campaign to raise \$110 million to fight this disease. Our Club has committed to help in two ways: (1) by dedicating all Hixon Award contributions to

Project Eliminate and (2) by soliciting donations from individuals and Corporations without infringing on our existing fundraising efforts for the children of Chatham County.

Here are the ways you can help:

- Private Donations One-time or multi-year pledges
- Matching Gifts Some Corporations will match employees' direct donations to charities
- Designated Annual Foundation gift Each year we solicit donations to our local foundation, you can designate this gift to Project Eliminate
- Corporate Gifts Many Corporations or their Foundations will give only directly to charities and will not give through third parties like our local Kiwanis Club. Project Eliminate is a direct charity so it viable to solicit some of the major corporations in the area. They can give directly to Project Eliminate, and we will receive credit as well.
