Hesse Bear Buddy Program

Hesse Elementary & Middle School is The Landings' neighborhood public school, and its student population now exceeds 1,000 children. The Bear Buddy program is dedicated to providing tutorial support to children who need help in reading, math, and science. Adult volunteers and students are matched with assistance from a Hesse School coordinator; and volunteers can tutor from one person to an entire class, depending on their interest and comfort level. Bear Buddy volunteers also provide enrichment to Hesse's gifted classes, by teaching students to play the game of chess.



Sixteen Kiwanis of Skidaway volunteers were involved with the Bear Buddy program during the 2011/12 school year and supplied over 700 hours of support to Hesse students. With the 2012/13 school year ready to commence, we are looking forward to Kiwanis volunteers once again stepping up to make a difference in a child's life. Backpack Buddy Program

A Partnership with America's Second Harvest

Chatham County's Backpack Buddy Program was started in 2008 by Landings residents Norm and Julie Hirsch and Congregation Mickve Israel to provide weekend meal packages for elementary school students identified by their school administrators as being at risk for childhood hunger. For the 2012/13 school year, over 25 congregations

and civic organizations are involved in the program, serving 1,500 children.

On Skidaway Island, Skidaway Island United Methodist Church joined the program in early 2012 and will be serving about 130 students at Butler Elementary School for the 2012/13 school year. SIUMC purchases most foods from America's Second Harvest. A typical weekend pack includes: 2 white milks, 2 chocolate milks, 2 fruit juices, 4 proteins, 2 vegetables, 2 fruits, 2 cereals, and 1-2 snacks. The cost for each pack is about \$2. Kiwanians who would like to participate in this effort can do so in three ways: (1) hands-on help – helping to pack food packs or deliver them to the school; (2) financial help – sponsoring meals for one or more students for a weekend, month, or school year; and (3) spiritual help – praying for the Backpack Buddy program's participating schools, students, and volunteers.
