Dollars for Doers Thank You

Thank you for the generous donation to the Exchange Club Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse of the Coastal Empire, Inc. The Center sponsors a number of programs that seek to significantly reduce the incidence of child abuse and neglect.

Through the Time Out Teddy program, children subjected to neglect are given a Teddy Bear by first-response police officers. This small gift may help the child find temporary security until he or she can be removed from the unsafe environment or circumstances.

Another vital service is the distribution of information on the dangers of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Shaken Baby Syndrome/Abusive Head Trauma. This material is distributed to expectant mothers, parents, and caregivers of infants through the local hospitals.

A Child Abuse Prevention Poster Contest is also offered to all 4th grade students in Chatham County. The contest is based on a different theme each year, and the students are encouraged to be as creative as they wish. Awards are given and winners are announced in April during Child Abuse Prevention Month.

A program that is near and dear to us is the Quick-Think-A-Thon. This is an annual tournament developed by the Exchange Club Center. It is based on the Think Quick! game and helps children make good, quick decisions about personal safety. Children playing the Think Quick! game respond to situations involving child abuse, abduction, peer pressure with alcohol, drugs, weapons, fire and medical emergencies, approaches by strangers, and latch-key issues. Each spring, a Quick-Think-A-Thon tournament is held. One 2nd grader from each elementary school competes—last year, there were over 2,000 competitors. *(continued)*

Special Olympics Bowling

On November 13th and 14th Special Olympics held two bowling sessions, on 60 lanes, at the AMF Savannah Lanes. Twenty-seven (27) Kiwanians, plus students from Savannah Country Day School, volunteered to help the children bowl.

A number of the children were in wheelchairs, plus many others with different medical problems and learning disabilities. There is very little verbal communication from the children, but you feel their enthusiasm. Assisting them bowl, seeing their expressions and cheering when "some" pins go down is a wonderful experience for our volunteers. Balls get dropped, some knock over a few pins and many go in the gutters. But it is an exciting time for all!

At the end of the morning, all the bowlers are awarded ribbons for competing on their respective lanes. Our Kiwanis donation to Special Olympics helps to buy the ribbons and medals given out to the winter bowling and spring track contestants. For this bowling event, our Kiwanian volunteer time totaled eighty-one hours.

Special Olympics personnel have expressed their many thanks to our club for our volunteers and funds helping obtain successful events for the children, parents and teachers.

United Way Exceeds Goal, Thanks Skidaway Island and Kiwanis...

The United Way of Coastal Empire's 2013 campaign results are in, and the \$8,731,900 raised exceeded the \$8,675,000 goal by \$56,000. And what was Skidaway's contribution when the dust cleared?

Skidaway's philanthropy is legendary and our results continue to demonstrate the significant contribution our community makes to the overall economic welfare of Savannah. With such economic influence comes economic responsibility. And we do not shy away from understanding and responding to this responsibility.

Skidaway's \$632,900 contribution (120% of our goal of \$530,450) was \$103,000 over goal and the largest contribution to the United Way's 2013 Campaign with the exception of Gulfstream.

This kind of philanthropy begs the question, where does my investment go? How do I know the United Way of Coastal Empire is a good steward of my donation? I want our residents to know that the leading independent evaluator of charities is Charity Navigator (J.D. Powers of the charity evaluators) and they have given the United Way of Coastal Empire the highest rating, 4 Stars, for fiscal management, commitment, and accountability for the fifth consecutive year. This distinction is bestowed on only 5% of the charities evaluated by Charity Navigator.

I began the Skidaway UW Campaign with a letter to your residence asking, why should you contribute? I encouraged you to "pay it forward", because we are all just one unfortunate event away from needing the help of the United Way. Thank you for answering this request to support the United Way.

I am proud to have represented Skidaway Island to the broader Coastal Community. Your act of generosity will be utilized in big and small ways, day in and day out until we do it all over again in 2014. In the final analysis, paying it forward is a journey, not a destination.

A final thanks to all my pals at Kiwanis, who joined in one final act of giving by stuffing 4,200 resident tubes on a Friday afternoon two weeks ago. Thanks for letting me learn the lessons of philanthropy from those who display random acts of kindness every day. I am in the company of giants!!!!!!
