Our first impression of the attendees was the number of young people. They were everywhere. Full of enthusiasm and energy, they made you feel the future of Kiwanis was in good hands. Fact: There are now more Key Club members than Kiwanians.

There was a concern because Kiwanis membership has been decreasing, a concern we at Skidaway share. I came back with some ideas I will be sharing in the coming months. There were sessions on fundraising, public relations, keeping members happy and lots of ways to celebrate. Again we came back with ideas to share. We went to a delegates meeting, (there were 1,600 delegates) where we voted on amendments. The one that directly affects us was a \$10.00 increase in dues. This is the first increase in dues in 12 years. We also attended a large session in which we learned about Kiwanis through the decades. We are now experts, just ask us.

These are just some of the highlights. The trip was worth attending. We should be proud to be a part of the greatest service organization in the world. Kiwanis—100 years old, kids at heart. - *Joyce Glenn*

Special Report: Kiwanis at 100

1915 — JANUARY 21

Kiwanis is founded in Detroit, MI.

1916 — MAY 18-19

The first convention is held in Cleveland, OH. Business includes approving the organization's constitution and electing George Hixson as the president of the "National Kiwanis Club."

1918 — The first Kiwanis head-quarters is established in Chicago, IL. On **MAY 21**, convention attendees in Birmingham, AL, raise \$17,500 in less than 10 hours to buy Kiwanis from founder Allen Browne.

1920 — Total membership reaches 28,500 in 267 clubs. Roe Fulkerson coins the motto "We Build," saying Kiwanis clubs build communities.

1922 — Toronto, Ontario, hosts the first convention outside the U.S.

1924 — Total membership reaches nearly 90,000, with more than 1,200 clubs.

1925 — Kiwanis sponsors the first Key Club, at Sacramento High School in California.

1940 — Walter Zeller donates 25 Canadian silver dollars to be auctioned off, establishing the fund we know today as the Kiwanis International Foundation.

1947 — The first Circle K International club, for male college and university students, is chartered.

1961 — Kiwanis International convention delegates vote to open clubs outside the United States and Canada.

1963 — FEBRUARY 25

The first club in Europe is organized in Vienna, Austria.

1968 — Kiwanis International Europe is formed.

1973 — Circle K opens its membership to women.

1975 — Builders Club becomes an official Kiwanis-sponsored program for young teens.

1982 — Kiwanis International opens its office at 3636 Woodview Trace in Indianapolis, IN.

1987 - JULY 7

After years of deliberation, delegates approve an amendment to welcome female members into Kiwanis clubs.

1987 — Golden K of Skidway is chartered in Savannah, GA.

1994 — Kiwanis joins the fight to eliminate iodine deficiency disorders. Members resolve to raise \$75 million.

1996 — Golden K of Skidaway is the largest Golden K club in the world, with 331 members.

1999 — K-Kids club officially joins the Kiwanis family as a service club for elementary school students.

2000 — Aktion Club, for adults living with disabilities, joins the Kiwanis family as a sponsored program.

2004 — Service leadership is introduced to teenage students through Key Leader weekends.

2005 — Golden K of Skidaway becomes Kiwanis Club of Skidaway.

2005 — "Serving the Children of the World" becomes the new Kiwanis motto.

2006 — Kiwanis Club of Skidaway introduces its new logo and website.

2010 — JUNE 24

At the 2010 Kiwanis International convention in Las Vegas, NV, Kiwanis pledges to raise US\$110 million and join UNICEF in the effort to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus from countries still affected by the disease.

2015 — JANUARY 21

Kiwanis celebrates its 100th anniversary.

2015 — JANUARY TO JUNE

The Kiwanis Centennial Tour, hosted by 2014–2015 President John Button, stops in various cities throughout the world.

2015 — JUNE 25-28

Kiwanis members worldwide gather in Indianapolis, IN for the 100th Anniversary Celebration at the Kiwanis International convention held jointly with the Key Club and Circle K conventions and the Aktion Club TLC conference.

2015 — **OCTOBER**

Sue Petrisin becomes the first female Kiwanis International president.

Kiwanis 100 Years Old, Young at Heart

Special Report: Savannah Early Childhood Foundation

June 25, 2015

Much has occurred since Savannah Early Childhood Foundation (SECF) last reported to Skidaway Kiwanis:

- We completed our third year of Early Learning College (ELC) by expanding to our third neighborhood (out of nine at full build out).
- Total attendance of the first two years of ELC was 1,700
 300+ parents attending 5-6 class sessions each.
- Armstrong State University has built a data base for SECF to maintain attendance records and pre/post test data. Soon this data base will produce progress reports and support longitudinal studies.
- SECF continues to "stitch" more existing community resources to the fabric of the endeavor: The number today exceeds 30 community partners.
- A pilot was conducted for a new mode of learning in which parents work with their child to demonstrate use of knowledge acquired in the classroom.
- International Paper created a unique sabbatical for SECF Executive Director Mike O'Neal that pays full salary and benefits while he is working full time on early childhood endeavors.
- Mike O'Neal's story was featured in Fortune magazine as one of 55 national "Employee Heroes of the Fortune

- City of Savannah approved a \$25,000 budget line item to support Parent University
- SCCPSS approved a \$50,000 budget line item to support Parent University
- (At this writing) We are confident Chatham County will approve funding for this line item.
- June 2015 Parent Univerity graduation broke 2014 record of graduates—2014: 170 graduates, 2015: 207 graduates.
- Since inception, SECF has raised \$400,000 in private funds with \$70,000 in the bank. Public funds highlighted above will represent 33% of the total cost/year at full build out (nine neighborhoods).
- This summer the Executive Management Team is raising funds and developing increased human capital to support expansion plans in order to double the number of neighborhoods served commencing this fall, from three neighborhoods to six.

The whole early childhood team truly appreciates Kiwanis' continued support!!


