## **Division 4 Rally Recap**

Approximately 70 Kiwanians representing the six clubs in Division 4 (Brunswick, Jesup, Saint Marys, Savannah, Skidaway, and Waycross) welcomed Georgia District Governor Jimmy McCorlew to our Rally on Friday, March 13. The meeting, hosted by our club, provided an opportunity for all attendees to learn what's happening across our division and the Georgia district.

In his remarks, Jimmy reemphasized his vision for the district and encouraged all clubs to strive to become "distinguished" before year end. He encouraged all clubs to focus on membership growth and complimented our club on its successful efforts so far. Also, he asked all clubs to have representation at both upcoming conventions – the Kiwanis

International Convention scheduled for June in Indianapolis and the Georgia District Convention scheduled for August in Columbus. Jimmy also presented the Georgia Leadership award to Stephen Kinney, president of the Saint Marys club.

Three Henry Heinz awards were also presented at the Rally. I value our weekly meetings and know I will always learn something new and enjoy a laugh too. Our projects and fund raisers directly impact at-risk youth in the Savannah community and it makes me very proud to be an integral part of such a worthy movement. I believe it is critical to lead by example and hope these programs empower students, teens and young adults to make a positive impact through service and leadership in their futures."
- **Frank Liebgott** (member since 2010): "Kiwanis is a wonderful combination of two fulfilling experiences. First, it is a great opportunity to give back to the community in a meaningful and important way, helping children at risk who are not in ideal situations to change their life experience. And second, the Kiwanis environment, working with like-minded men and women is stimulating and rewarding."
- Joyce Glenn (president-elect, member since 2004): "Kiwanis has many meanings for all of us. We enjoy the Thursday morning meetings, the fellowship, the informative programs, and time spent with friends. I, too, enjoy the Thursday meetings, but for me it is the service Kiwanis provides to The Landings community and to Savannah's underprivileged children that has the most meaning. Our fundraising events are also community events. They provide opportunities for people to gather and strengthen the feeling of community here at the Landings. Most important is service to Savannah's neediest children. For me personally the service we provide L.O.V.E. is important. With the money and volunteers from Kiwanis, L.O.V.E. mentors provide at-risk kids academic help and a stable caring adult in their lives. I am always proud to say I'm a Kiwanian. The response from people is usually, 'Kiwanis they do really good things for the community.' Yes, we do! I am glad to be a part of this great organization."

## Agency News—Back Pack Buddies Update

We asked Joy Howard, Skidaway Island Back Pack Buddies Program Director, to give us an update on the program this year. Joy says, "Our Skidaway Island Back Pack Buddies program provides weekend meals for 70 students (3rd through 5th grades) at Butler Elementary School. All of these children are eligible for federally sponsored free lunch (as well as breakfast and supper) at school 5 days a week. However, when they come into school on Mondays, the teachers notice many kids are hungry and lethargic with low attention spans and little energy after the weekend. Back Pack Buddies steps in to this gap providing food to sustain these children throughout the weekend."

She continued, "The Kiwanis grant this year has provided approximately one third of our funding for the program resulting in approximately 600 lbs of nourishment delivered each week for distribution to these children. It is a heavy load each week, but the strong hearts and backs of many Kiwanis volunteers have helped make the deliveries manageable."

Tim Baldwin, Kiwanis liaison to the program, reported that since October 2014, eight Kiwanians have volunteered a total of 38 hours to deliver food to the school. "The Back Pack Buddies program winds up in early May, so we'll have at least another five or six deliveries before it ends. Thanks to all who have volunteered their time to this worthy cause."
