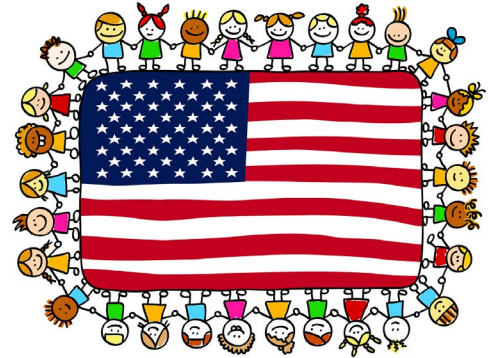

Bethesda's Golf Program: Origins to Today

Bob Caswell, a former Skidaway Kiwanian and a board member of Bethesda, initiated a golf program for the school in 2006. With fellow Kiwanians' contribution of clubs, bags, and balls, the program was launched. However, with no place to play or practice, "golf" consisted of hitting balls into the pasture adjacent to the school.

The following year, Bob negotiated an agreement with Bacon Park to allow the boys to use the driving range and, if open time was available, to play a few holes. That was the year I signed on as Bob's assistant. Later that year, when Bob relocated back to Chicago to be near family, I assumed his role and have been the volunteer golf coach for the past seven years. Later, the Landings Club, in the spirit of giving back to the community, agreed to allow Bethesda and other area schools to practice and host golf matches on our courses in the late afternoons.

Bethesda's golf season begins the first week of February and ends in April with twice-a-week practice and usually 5-6 matches during that period. Scoring is double par max, we play the forward tees, and coaching is permitted during the round.

Most of the boys have never held a golf club or even seen a golf course; so starting with the basics is a necessity.

One of the boys, when seeing the manicured green grounds asked, "Is this Astro turf?" When failing to reach the green with an 8 iron, the boy selected a 5 iron for his next shot. When asked why, his response was, "I didn't make it with the 8 and since I am closer now I thought I would use the 5 iron." Logical to the uninitiated.

In another instance, after hitting his ball into a lagoon, the player questioned if it was acceptable to retrieve his ball. I said yes and turned to assist another player. When looking back, they boy, with long pants and his shoes on, was knee deep in water excited about the prospect of finding not only his ball but several others as well.

In one of the school's first matches, I instructed the team to go to the practice putting green while I registered them. Upon my return they were all standing next to the green while the other teams were putting. When asked why they stopped their response was "they showed up and came onto the green," as if they didn't belong.

As a coach and hopefully as a mentor, my reward has been, through the years, to watch the boys grow by employing some of life's lessons through golf—integrity, sportsmanship, respect, and self confidence—ensuring their scores are recorded accurately, complimenting others on a good shot or effort, and most importantly walking the fairways with participants from the other schools because they feel that they *do* belong.

Coastal Conservation Association's Kids' Fishing Derby Set for May 24

Kids of Landings residents and their guests are invited to participate in the Coastal Conservation Association's annual Free Kids' Fishing Derby. The Derby will be held on Saturday, May 24th from 8:30 AM until 11 AM, courtesy of CCA at the Kids' Fishing Lagoon (#56) behind the fire house near the intersection of Westcross and Log Landing Roads in Oakridge.

The derby provides a fun outdoor experience and introduces kids to the excitement of fishing, promotes sportsmanship and conservation, and provides family fun. Children as young as 3 and as old as 15 are welcome; however, each child must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Registration at Lagoon #56 is from 8:30 AM to 9 AM; fishing is from 9 AM until 10:30 AM, and prizes will be awarded at 11 AM. Prizes will be awarded in a large variety of categories, and contestants will be grouped by age to give all kids a fair chance of winning. Every child receives a CCA Fishing Cap at registration.

Additionally this year CCA is providing a free \$10 CCA Youth Membership to every family. All young anglers will benefit from the conservation information contained in the magazines they receive.

Participants should bring fishing gear and bait, if possible, and also insect repellent, something to drink, hats, sunscreen, folding chairs, and shoes with good support. A portable toilet will be available. Bandy's Bait Shop has worms and crickets. Bandy's is located on your left by the community boat ramp just beyond the new bridge at Skidaway Narrows.

Poles and bait will be available on a first come basis. Members CCA's Skidaway Chapter will be on hand to give assistance and instruction as needed.

Lagoon #56 has just been stocked with over 2,500 bluegills to provide many catching opportunities for the kids. Some largemouth bass are available, too. Please do not remove bluegills to ensure there will be plenty of them for the kids to catch on Derby Day. Remember only adults accompanied by a fishing child can fish at Lagoon #56. Adults may fish at any of the other lagoons at The Landings.
