Interfaith Hospitality Network Open House Tours

Our Kiwanis Club of Skidaway supports the Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN), both financially and with our donations of personal time. IHN provides food, shelter, and counseling for qualified homeless families with children. The families stay overnight in churches, one week at a time, where they receive dinner, breakfast, and a packed lunch. The IHN van picks up the families from church and delivers them to a day center and school age children to their schools in Savannah. At the day center, the parents work on finding housing, getting a job (if needed), attending to laundry, child care, showering, and receiving counseling. The van returns the families from the day center to the church for dinner and their overnight stay.

IHN is holding open houses through to acquaint anyone interested with details of how the program functions and to provide a tour of the new day center, which opened in 2007. Club Distributes \$82,300 to Local Agencies

Kiwanis of Skidaway celebrated a successful 2012-2013 fundraising year at its October 3 annual meeting, attended by representatives from 22 local agencies and programs that serve at-risk children and their families in the greater Savannah area. President Dan Umbel announced \$82,300 of grants to local agencies, and \$3,210 of previously given grants beyond Savannah, bringing total financial support to \$85,510 for 2012-2013.

Our club awarded grants aggregating \$80,000 to the following agencies: America's Second Harvest (in support of Kids Cafe and the Skidaway Island Backpack Buddy program at Butler Elementary School), Bethesda Academy, Court-Appointed Special Advocates for Children (CASA), Childhood Cancer Family Support, Corporate Academy, Greenbriar Children's Home, Horizons, Horsin' Around, Interfaith Hospitality Network, Junior Achievement, Local Outreach Volunteer Educators (L.O.V.E.), Music Medicine Institute, Park Place Outreach, Performance Initiatives, Savannah Early Childhood Foundation, Savannah Friends of Music, Social Apostolate, Special Olympics, Wesley Community Centers of Savannah, West Broad YMCA, and Youth Challenge Academy. We also provided \$500 to the newly established Circle K Club at

Armstrong Atlantic State University to support leadership training.

Dollars for Doers Awards. In addition, our club made six \$300 grants, aggregating \$1,800, through our Dollars for Doers program during 2012-2013 to the following agencies: Agudath Achim Synagogue (for their Backpack Buddy program), Coastal Conservation Association of Skidaway (for the Kids' Fishing Derby), Crohns and Colitis Foundation (for Camp Oasis), SAFE Shelter, Special Pops Tennis of Savannah, and The Salvation Army.
